

## **Instructions for Registering with the NCAA Clearinghouse**

**-Juniors and seniors who plan on participating in college athletics must register with the NCAA Clearinghouse to determine their eligibility. The Clearinghouse makes sure that a student meets the academic requirements and the amateurism requirements to participate in college sports.**

**-Go to [www.eligibilitycenter.org](http://www.eligibilitycenter.org) to create an account and register (preferably during junior year). Click on “Prospective Student Athletes” and follow the steps provided.**

**-There is a \$60 registration fee for the Clearinghouse. Students eligible for a fee waiver (those who receive free or reduced lunch) should contact Mrs. Yesso.**

**-After registration is complete, contact Mrs. Yesso to send a copy of your high school transcript to the Clearinghouse. Transcripts will be sent at the end of your junior year, during senior year, and after graduation.**

**-It is important for student-athletes to take the proper academic core courses needed for eligibility. A list of Redemptorist courses that are considered core for the NCAA curriculum can be found on the eligibility center website. Students and parents should be monitoring that they are taking the right courses and making the right grades starting in freshman year!**

**-It is important to note that courses taken through many correspondence or distance learning programs are no longer eligible to count as an NCAA core course.**

**-When students sign up to take the ACT or SAT, they must choose the Clearinghouse as one of the places that they send their scores. The code 9999 should be used for this purpose. If one does not send a score to the**

**Clearinghouse at time of test registration, an extra fee will be required to send it at a later date.**

**-GPA will be calculated using only the grades received in core classes. A minimum of a 2.0 GPA is required for eligibility. If you need help calculating your core GPA, please see Mrs. Yesso.**

**DIVISION I**

**16 Core-Course Curriculum**

**16 Core Courses:**

4 years of English.

**3 years of mathematics (Algebra I or higher).**

2 years of natural/physical science (1 year of lab if offered by high school).

1 year of additional English, mathematics or natural/physical science.

2 years of social science.

4 years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or nondoctrinal religion/philosophy).

**DIVISION II**

**14 Core-Course Curriculum**

**14 Core Courses:**

3 years of English.

2 years of mathematics (Algebra I or higher).

2 years of natural/physical science (1 year of lab if offered by high school).

2 years of additional English, mathematics or natural/physical science.

2 years of social science.

3 years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or nondoctrinal religion/philosophy).

**PLEASE NOTE:** Beginning August 1, 2013, students planning to attend an NCAA Division II institution will be required to complete 16 core courses.

**-Division I Schools use a sliding scale to determine eligibility. The Clearinghouse uses sum ACT scores (the 4 section scores added together). Corresponding SAT scores also available on website.**
