New Rule: Rosary kits must be purchased from the Campus Ministry Office, room 48. The kits are \$5 per kit. Rosaries are to be made by the students and then returned to the Campus Ministry office, room 48, for approval. The campus minister, Mrs. Shaffett, will then assign the student to a location to donate the rosaries. The students will be given a form to have signed by the facility for which the rosaries were donated. In order to allow time for the rosaries to be constructed and donated the following rule will strictly apply: **No rosary kits will be sold after February 28, 2012 and no rosaries will be accepted for donation after March 2, 2012.**
